

DATSUN WINS SCCA TWO-FIVE CHALLENGE AT LAGUNA SECA
Westport, Conn., October 16, 1971 -- Datsun today won the Sports Car Club
of America's Manufacturer's Championship series for the under 2.5 liter
sedans by capturing the 110-mile Two-Five Challenge race over the twising
1.9-mile Laguna Seca course. Brock Racing Enterprises Datsun 510 driver
John Morton of Torrance, California, was declared the winner after Horst
Kwech's Wetson Alfa Romeo GTV was disqualified for having an oversized
fuel tank.

Kwech of Gurnee, Illinois, took the checkered flag ahead of Morton, who had to stop for fuel late in the race. Kwech's Wetson Alfa, which went the full distance without stopping, ran out of fuel just after taking the checkered flag. A lengthy post-race inspection revealed that Kwech's fuel tank capacity was found to be in excess of the legal maximum 15 gallons. The BRE Datsun was also inspected for any infringement of the SCCA's Two-Five Challenge series rules and was tound in complete conformity.

With eight out of the ten Two-Five Challenge races counting in the final standings, Datsun and Alfa Romeo each finished the season with 60 points. The tie was broken in Datsun's favor, however, on the basis of the number of first place finishes. Datsun had a total of six first place finishes while Alfa Romeo recorded four.

Scoring in the Two-Five Challenge series is computed on the basis of points earned from the best eight finishes in the 10 race schedule. Thus, while Alfa Romeo had a total of 73 points for the season, only 60 could be counted. Datsun had a total of 60 points. BMW's earned 25 points to finish third in the Two-Five Challenge standings followed by Ford of England with three and British Leyland with two.


